SAFETY TIPS FOR INTERNET AND CELL PHONES

With more and more hackers and cyber criminals, we thought it would a good idea to pass on some tips and tricks to help reduce the risk of becoming a victim of fraud for our February program. I know this firsthand as my dad was having computer problems. He had a box pop up and they told him he had a virus, and they could help him. Of course, he thought WOW how convenient. He ended up giving them his credit card number. Thank goodness his bank caught it as fraud and declined the payment.

On a much larger scale, my husband runs a casino in western Oklahoma. Because of their advanced IT department, they can catch the hackers. They get about 140 hits per week from Russia and China. If they did not have securities in place, it would cause major issues with their business.

So with that, some important Internet safety tips.

Always keep software up to date. The best way to make sure this always gets done is to turn on automatic updates. Also, using web browsers that receive frequent updates such as Chrome and Firefox.

Try to avoid scams. If it looks suspicious then it probably is! I get emails all the time from PayPal and Amazon saying my account has been suspended. They want you to click their link and put in your password. I always click on the email address used to see if it is real. 100% of the times I have checked the email doesn't have either of those companies in the address. If you are still unsure ask someone you know that is tech savvy!

Changing passwords and backing up data. I went to a seminar once and they suggested always adding a symbol (&\$#@) in your password. They said it makes it a billion (yes billion) times harder for a hacker to hack! I have put this into practice, and it has helped me tremendously. Backing up data is the only way you can get back your information if lost. You can set this up to do it automatically on an iPhone or a PC if you are backing up to the cloud. The cloud has its own set of issues, but it is a great option for now.

A lot of the same tips apply to cell phones. Don't click links that seem skeptical and backing up data. Did you know you can install antivirus software on your phone? I didn't. That is a great additional security measure.

Fake charging stations in public. This is yet another way hackers are getting your information. Also make sure to take a charger with you when you are traveling so that this is not an issue. Same goes for public Wi-Fi. Make sure it is safe and secure.






