## Dragonfly Home By: Michelle Burgard

For our December meeting we had the pleasure of having Halle Carr with Dragonfly Home speak to us about human trafficking in Oklahoma and how they help these individuals get back on their feet. Halle explained to us that she travels the state educating others on what trafficking is. Dragonfly Home helps individuals start over in a safe environment by helping them with housing, gas, necessities and food.

I learned that I did not have the correct understanding of what human trafficking is. Halle explained to us that it is not like the movies and tv shows with kids or teenage girls and boys being kidnapped and sold to someone abroad for sex or slave trade. So what is human trafficking here in Oklahoma? Human trafficking is when a person is traded for drugs, money or any other needs the trafficker has. We learned that human trafficking happens to many here in Oklahoma by a parent, guardian, family member or someone the victim lives with. This happens to kids as young as 5 years old to teenagers and older by building a relationship with the victim, building trust, coercion or use of violence to get what they want. If someone gives money or goods for sex that is trafficking. Due to the amount of lower income or individuals struggling to survive due to high crime, inflation, lower wages or medical issues, this has caused human trafficking to be higher in Oklahoma.

Dragonfly Home is working hard to help victims and to educate others on this growing issue in Oklahoma. Dragonfly Home is the only non-profit in Oklahoma City and central Oklahoma that is state certified by the office of the Attorney General to help victim-survivors. They were founded in March 2016 and received their certification in November 2016. Currently they have helped 900 victim-survivors and have fielded 8,000 phone calls since they started in 2016. They also opened a transition home in the fall of 2022. I could go on and on about what we learned. 
#### **CLUB PURPOSE**




