MAGIC SUITCASE

The Association of Desk and Derrick Clubs has created a program title "The Magic Suitcase" to introduce children to the

world of petrochemicals. A few members of our Club have seen the program, but, many have not. Our new to us member, Jamie Sabata, adjusted the program to the adult level and presented "The Senior Magic Suitcase" for our June program.

Jamie brought a suitcase full of products that we use today and that are made from petrochemicals – materials made from liquids contained in crude oil and natural gas. The most common petrochemical products used today are synthetic polymers (plastics and synthetic rubber).

Polyethylene is the most widely used plastic in the world. As examples, in Jamie's suitcase, she pulled out a plastic grocery bag, plastic bottle, Styrofoam container, and even a Tupperware container. Other polyethylene includes outdoor furniture, siding for homes, floor tiles and so many other items we use every day.

Polyolefin, another petrochemical, is used in shrink wrap and scuba diving suits to name a couple.

What isn't **polyester** used in? It's used in everything from home furnishings, blankets, clothing and synthetic wigs. As a matter of fact, Jamie didn't have a wig in her suitcase, she had one on her head, and no one even knew! Jamie shared a mouse pad, pillow and stuffed animal from her suitcase – all made of polyester.

Polyurethane products have many uses. Over three-fourths of the global usage of this product is in the form of polyurethane foam, either flexible or rigid.

And, of course, a widely used material made from petrochemicals is **vinyl**. Some include tablecloths, decals, vinyl records, vinyl siding and flooring. Unlike some petrochemical products, vinyl can be recycled.

And, then there's **Polyvinylchloride** or PVC for pipe. **Polycarbonate** is used in computer monitors, CDs, eyeglasses, traffic lights plus lots more. Don't forget **nylon**, one of the first commercially used petrochemicals (toothbrush bristles).

The list of items we use daily that are made with petrochemicals is endless and too many for a suitcase. Thank you, Jamie, for reminding us of the many petrochemical uses and how our industry contributes.


