LOOKIN' AROUND

"Geology in the early days of exploring for oil was hunting exposed asphalt beds and oil springs. Divining rods, much like the old-timers used to locate water, were tried, but were soon replaced by the "Doodlebug", that very secret and magic device claimed by the inventors to be capable of locating oil.

Surface structures, yucca weed, and anything which, according to oil field lore, might give a hint there was oil underneath were studied and surveyed, but Oklahoma's oil pioneers did not think much of spending time and money on geology. One early day operator got his start in the oil producing business by purchasing leases on land that had been turned down by the geologist for one of the independent oil companies. He recognized a pronounced surface structure which he felt would produce. He drilled 32 wells, the smallest of which had the potential of producing 880 barrels of oil a day, and the largest over 4000 barrels a day.

Searching for oil and gas is hard work, requires lots of money and there is no sure thing. As Adrian Swift (from Mannford, OK) put it 'I've never opened an oil field in my life because of what I knew was there. It was what I didn't know was there and wanted to find out. If you have to nail it down to a cinch, there never would be a well drilled.'"

The Desk and Derrick Educational Trust (ET) will accept scholarship applications for the 2023-2024 academic years from students seeking degrees in fields related to the energy and allied industries. Geology, geophysics, petroleum engineering, chemical engineering, mechanical engineering, energy management and nuclear engineering majors qualify. An application form and checklist are enclosed. The application form is also available in PDF format on the ET website, <u>www.theeducationaltrust.org</u>. Email us at <u>info@theeducationaltrust.org</u>

Applications must be received by April 1, 2023 for consideration.

Approximately 10 to 15 scholarships are awarded annually with amounts ranging from \$1,000 to \$4,000 for students. The required minimum overall GPA is 3.25. A candidate will only be contacted if they are a recipient of a scholarship award. We would appreciate your cooperation in distributing this information to students who qualify for these scholarships. This information has also been sent to the financial aid office of your institution.


Scholarships are paid directly to the school that the selected applicant attends. Upon receiving the student's proof of enrollment, current overall grade point average and declared major, the first half of the scholarship will be paid for the Fall Semester. The second payment will be made at the appropriate time for the Spring Semester, if documentation is provided to prove the student has maintained eligibility as required.


