

## CARTER COUNTY FIELD TRIPPIN'

Friday, November 3, 2023 was a perfectly wonderful weather day for a field trip. So, off eight of us went to the Ardmore area to learn a little more about our industry. Michelle Burgard, along with guests Vivian Guan and Wendy Wilkinson, Tim Parrish, Marcy Ebert, Debi Sheline and I met up with Wichita Falls Desk and Derrick Club President, Sheila McGaughey, at the Flying J Truck Stop, located on the north side of Ardmore, and headed west to C P Energy LLC's Wasson Station. There we met up with C P Energy representatives Barry, Mike and Nick.

The Wasson Station is where the C P Energy tank trucks off load their product. The station consists of twelve 400 barrel storage tanks. Four tank trucks can off load their product at the same time. Our "product hauler" was Nick who was getting ready to off load his third load of the day (he started at 3:00 a.m.). Nick rigged up the hose and started off loading the oil while he, Mike and Barry explained the process of "working" the oil prior to picking it up at its original location.

Nick's truck contains many instruments that you might find in a chemistry classroom. He uses a Plumb Bob to measure the amount of product in the tank. He then uses a Woodback to check the temperature of the product in the middle of the tank. He uses a "Thief" to capture samples of the product that he then puts in a beaker and processes for 5 minutes in the centrifuge attached to his truck "lab" to check the purity of the product. His lab also consists of various hydrometers that he uses to check temperature and gravity of the product. All this information is used to determine the value of the product and is included on the run ticket turned in at the time the product is off loaded.

As the oil is off loaded, it first goes to one of the two northwest tanks. These two tanks each contain a mixer to keep the product from settling. From there, the product is moved to one of the other tanks and then to the L.A.C.T. unit – Lease Automatic Custody Transfer unit. This equipment receives oil from the tanks, processes it, measures it, includes all kinds of safety features, then sends the product up the hill to go into the pipeline, then on to the refinery.

We all had many questions, and these gentlemen were very patient and answered every one of them in language we could understand. Many thanks to them!

Next, we got in our vehicles and drove east into Ardmore to C P Energy's yard where Chance had prepared a hamburger (with all the fixings) feast for us. They were excellent hamburgers, beans, etc.! As an added treat, the President of C P Energy, LLC, John Caldwell, drove down from their Edmond head-quarters to have lunch with us. He encouraged us to keep doing what we're doing. He said that in order for our country to continue to flourish, it needs a strong energy industry.

What a great learning experience for us. This was such an informative field trip that we all enjoyed! Thanks to C P Energy, LLC!

BUT, we weren't quite finished. We remembered our September speaker, Cecil Duke, telling us about the Oil Patch Warrior Statue in downtown Ardmore. So, while we were there, we just went! This statue represents the men from Ardmore who worked a top secret mission in England in World War II. This statue is a replica of the original statue located in Nottinghamshire, England. All in all, it was a great day!


